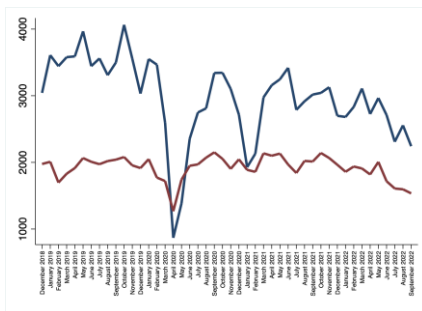


This newsletter has been designed to provide you with regular correspondence and updates from your Specialty Advisory Committee (SAC).

COVID and Training



Elective trainee operating activity is declining. It's a big concern. The graph shows eelogbook entries from Neurosurgery trainees over the past three years. Red is acute, blue is elective. The last 2-3 months data is probably a bit incomplete but the overall picture is increasingly clear and this is common to other specialties too.
